This was the most frustrating webinar experience I've done since COVID-19 made them necessary. The instructor wouldn't show us the spreadsheets during the examples, so it made it impossible to follow along. Additionally, the instructor kept getting mixed up during the lesson, so it led to further confusion. During the quiz the instructor often took down the questions leading to lost time and shortening the actual quiz time. Finally, the quiz was not based on the content of the slides provided rather what he spoke about this made it difficult as this is a webinar and audio quality is not great. This program requires a lot of work to make it more viable.	This has been discussed with the trainer, who will now provide all materials prior to the actual training. Quiz logistics have also been discussed and modified.
Evaluation of Measurement Uncertainty is a very challenging topic to cover remotely/webinar. At times it was hard to follow along in excel, as the formulas for the cells can only be seen when the instructor is clicking on the cell.
